POINTS TO REMEMBER

- Every paragraph begins with a key sentence or topic sentence.
- The sentences that follow the topic sentence provide information related to the key sentence.
- Normally a paragraph may have around 8 10 sentences each.
- More than that it becomes a challenge for the writer to bring coherence to the paragraph.
- Unity, order, coherence and linkers or logical connecters are very important in a good paragraph.



PARAGRAPH WRITING

- Objective: To acquire the skills of composing and writing a good and coherent paragraph.
- The opinion of Wren and Martin, "a paragraph is a number of sentences grouped together and relating to one topic or a group of related sentences that develop a single point."
- So, a paragraph is a group of sentences that talk about one idea or point of argument or one situation as a single thing.



- Unity
- Clarity
- Emphasis
- Variety



UNITY

- A paragraph should have single central idea.
- It is called topic sentence.
- Usually it will be the first sentence of the paragraph.
- The unity of the thought must be there in the paragraph.
- The supporting sentences should provide details relevant to the paragraph.
- Usually a good topic sentence depends on the theme selected.
- There should be no irrelevant matter in paragraph that has no relation with the topic sentence.



CLARITY

- The sentences should be arranged in a logical way that brings an order to the paragraph.
- There should be free flow of thoughts.
- Each sentence should be connected with the other sentence in a coherent way.



EMPHASIS

- The space provided for each sentence that supports the topic sentence should have the same importance.
- i.e., it should be given equal importance in the formulation of the paragraph.



VARIETY

- The paragraph should be of different length to avoid monotony.
- This helps in the construction of a good paragraph.
- The sentence construction should also have variety to avoid monotony.
