

REPORT ON KNOWLEDGE ENRICHMENT PROGRAM 2025

Sri Bhagawan Mahaveer Jain Evening College organized a three-day Knowledge Enrichment Program 2025 on "Innovative Pedagogy and Holistic Development: Empowering Educators for the Future" as an IQAC and IIC initiative. The objective of the program was to equip educators with technological knowledge, emotional resilience, empathy, career-oriented strategies, and value-based teaching approaches to enhance students' learning experiences.

Day 1: February 5, 2025

The first day of the event commenced at 5:30 PM with a general welcome by the Masters of Ceremony (MCs), Mr. Janardhana C. and Ms. Bhavani K. V. Although the Chief Patron, Dr. Chenraj Roychand, Patron Mr. Vishal Chenraj, and Vice President of Jain Group of Institutions, Sri Ravindra Bhandary, were unable to attend, they extended their best wishes and support for the program.

The event officially began with the lighting of the lamp by dignitaries, followed by the presence of the College Principal, Dr. K. M. Mahesh, and esteemed faculty members. The session featured two key speakers:

Dr. Dinesh N., Associate Professor, Department of Commerce and Management, and the KEP Introducer, provided an insightful overview of the program's objectives and theme. He set the context for Day 1, emphasizing the importance of holistic educator development and the role of innovative pedagogy in shaping the future of education.

Chief Guest: Dr. Anand Kulal

Dr. Anand Kulal delivered an insightful speech on the importance of teachers' well-being. He emphasized that educators' physical and mental health should be a top priority, as their well-being directly impacts the quality of education.

Keynote Speaker: Dr. Sathisha H. K.

Dr. Sathisha H. K. presented a keynote address on "Nurturing Emotional Intelligence and Holistic Development in Educators and Students." He traced the transformation of education from Krutayuga to the present era, highlighting the impact of technological advancements on the teaching profession.

He pointed out that while technology has eased many tasks for teachers, it has also created job insecurities, making continuous skill development essential. He emphasized that institutions often focus on infrastructure rather than educator empowerment, and he reinforced the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, which stresses vocational and skill-based learning.

Dr. Sathisha also urged educators to remain relevant, emotionally intelligent, and adaptable in changing times. He highlighted the Five Yamas (ethical principles) that educators should embody:

- Ahimsa Non-violence
- Satya Truthfulness
- Asteya Non-stealing
- · Brahmacharya Celibacy or fidelity
- Aparigraha Non-possessiveness

Furthermore, he stressed that true holistic development for educators can only be achieved when they are emotionally, socially, physically, mentally, and intellectually aware and fit. He recommended that educators allocate 1-5% of their earnings for professional development.

Both sessions were highly engaging, with active participation from attendees, making the learning experience truly enriching.

- Continuous learning is crucial—educators should constantly upgrade their skills to avoid becoming obsolete.

The event ended on a high note, leaving participants with valuable insights, inspiration, and motivation to embrace innovative teaching methodologies for the future.












